Required Items

Each day, please ensure your child has:

Cold/Snow

- A water bottle, a few snacks, and a lunch (that does not need to be kept cold or heated). No nuts are permitted as many students have allergies. This includes peanut butter and Nutella.
- It is a great idea to label all items that come to school with their last name.
- Seasonal warm clothing including a hat, mittens/gloves, scarf, coat, snow pants or splash pants, and extra socks.

Please note that snow pants are for warmth and not just for snow, *they go over regular pants*. The best stores in Moncton to buy them are Dollarama, Wal Mart, and Staples.

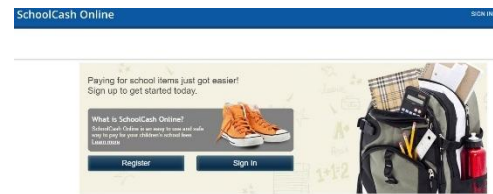
Fees

Families can place or cancel meal orders up until 8:00 a.m. the day before. Monday meal orders must be submitted by 8:00 a.m. on the previous Friday. Menus follow a two-week cycle with three meal options each day and can be ordered up to four weeks in advance.



Safe Arrival

This system lets you report your child's absence in advance. It will also contact you if your child is not in class at the beginning of the day. Please use the School Messenger App or phone 1-833-202-4304 any time of day, instead of contacting the school directly.

Homework

Every classroom is different. Check with your child's teacher to see if they assign homework.

<https://curriculum.nbed.ca/> or by going to the ASD-E district website> Student Learning> and selecting EECD Curriculum. There is not an individual classroom syllabus or paperwork given out to parents, although a teacher may choose to send you further information or newsletters.

The pace of the year and movement through the outcomes is determined by the students' mastery of the skills. They need to be able to explain the reasoning and logic of their correct answer before moving forward. For example, we teach math differently in Canada. We want students to deeply understand numbers so that they can be flexible to add, subtract, multiply and divide without having to write everything down.

Please ask your teacher if you have questions about what your child is working on.

Report Cards

Your child will bring home a report card (in an envelope) in December, April, and June. A mark of 1-4 is assigned in each subject area. After receiving the report, you will be invited to a "Parent-Teacher Conference" to talk about your child's progress. You can e-mail your teacher if you have questions or wish to meet at another time.

Field Trips

If your child's class is going on a field trip, you will receive information from their teacher and a permission slip to sign.

Fire Drills

We are required to practice what do in case of a fire or other emergency. The alarm is very loud for safety, and your child will be guided by staff through this process. We also practice full evacuation and lockdown drills.

Supervision

All students will be supervised by an adult on the playground between 7:30 and 7:50 am. Please drop off your child on the playground only during those times, and do not remain in the area. Students may come inside the school at 7:50 when the bell rings. If you arrive after 8 am, they are considered late and must sign in at the office.

Please note that students are not permitted to stay inside at recess time because there are no teachers available to supervise them. All students need to go outside at each recess time (morning and lunch). Parents can pack extra layers of clothing for their child if they are finding that Canadian temperatures are too cold.

Your child must be picked up at 2:20 pm at the end of the day as no teachers or office staff are available to supervise after school. This means your child will be left unattended, and it is best if they are safely picked up on time.

Drop Off Procedures

The “Kiss and Drop” is a car loop for you to drop off your child from your car. Please remain in the car when dropping off your child(ren). Please have your child ready (backpack too) when exiting on the sidewalk lane of your car. There will be adults in bright vests to help your child get out of the car. Parents may only use the right lane; *the left lane and parking lot are for staff only.*

You may also choose to park on Augusta or Crowbush Street and use the crosswalk to walk into school. Your child may be eligible to ride on the big yellow bus, depending on where you live. The bus number will be assigned to you by the school.

Pick Up

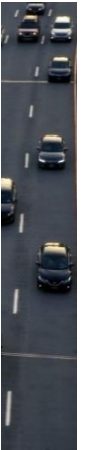
Parents may wait by the back playground or in front of their child’s assigned exit door. If someone else will be picking up your child, please inform the school in advance. Parents are not allowed to bring their cars inside of the parking lot at this time to allow staff members to leave. You can park in the community (please don’t block driveways) and walk over to collect your child(ren).

Bus drivers and teachers will release a student in Grades K-2 to a parent only. You must be waiting at the bus stop or pick up on the equipment playground. Grades 3-4 students will be allowed to walk home alone.

If you live close to the school, you may need to walk or drive instead. On the bus, students are expected to sit and not jump around. They must respect others and should not be eating food. Please sign up for the Transportation Portal to receive bus alerts (late or cancellations) and see specific bussing information for your child.

Bike Rack

Students may ride a bike or scooter to school and store it at the bike rack. It is your choice if they use a lock or not. They must wear a helmet while riding. Please walk the bike from Ryan Street to the rack.

7:50 School doors open for students.

7:30-7:50 Playground is open and supervised.

7:50 All students may enter the school and go directly to their classroom.

8:00 Morning bell rings followed by the O'Canada anthem and morning announcements.

(* After eight am, your child is late for school. *They must enter through the front door and sign in at the office.*)
